You'll need to knit to a fairly tight tension for this toy, particularly for the parts that require stuffing, to have it looking as plump and squishy as possible!

KNIT KIT

Yarn: King Cole Big Value DK, shades (A) 4020 White, (B) 4053 Black, (C) 4029 Red, (D) 4028 Orange, one 50g ball of each, DK shades (E) Yellow, (F) Green, (G) Blue, (H) Lilac, small amounts of each

Needles: 3.25mm Safety toy stuffing Buttons: round, black, two Plastic disc (e.g. plastic canvas circle or lid): 6-7cm diameter (optional) Stitch holder **Tapestry needle**

TENSION SQUARE

- 22 sts x 30 rows ■ 10cm x 10cm
- Stocking stitch 3.25mm needles

BODY AND HEAD

NOTE: knitted in one piece Using 3.25mm needles and yarn A, cast on six sts Row 1 (RS): (kfb) to end. 12 sts □ Row 2 and all foll even-numbered rows: p to end Row 3: (kfb) to end. 24 sts Row 5: (k1, kfb) to end. 36 sts \Box Row 7: (k2, kfb) to end. 48 sts \Box Row 9: (k3, kfb) to end. 60 sts \Box Row 11: (k4, kfb) to end. 72 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 15: (k5, kfb) to end. 84 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work 17 rows in st st \Box Row 33: (k5, k2tog) to end. 72 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work nine rows in st st □ Row 43: (k4, k2tog) to end. 60 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work seven rows in st st \Box Row 51: (k3, k2tog) to end. 48 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work five rows in st st

 \Box Row 57: (k2, k2tog) to end. 36 sts

 \Box Beg with a p row, work

three rows in st st □ Row 61: (k1, k2tog) to end. 24 sts □ Row 62 and all foll even-numbered rows: p to end \Box Row 63: (k1, kfb) to end. 36 sts \Box Row 65: (k2, kfb) to end. 48 sts \Box Row 67: (k3, kfb) to end. 60 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 71: (k4, kfb) to end. 72 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work 13 rows in st st □ Row 85: (k4, k2tog) to end. 60 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 89: (k3, k2tog) to end. 48 sts □ Row 90 and all foll even-numbered rows: p to end □ Row 91: (k2, k2tog) to end. 36 sts Row 93: (k1, k2tog) to end. 24 sts \Box Row 95: (k2tog) to end. 12 sts \Box Row 96: (p2tog) to end. Six sts \Box Cut yarn leaving a tail, thread through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off **BACK AND COWL** NOTE: knitted in one piece

Using 3.25mm needles and yarn B, cast on 40 sts Row 1 and all foll odd-numbered rows: p to end

□ Row 2 (RS): k19, m1, k2, m1. k19. 42 sts □ Row 4: k19, m1, k1, m1, k2, m1, k1, m1, k19. 46 sts □ Row 6: k19, m1, k1, m1, k6, m1, k1, m1, k19. 50 sts □ Row 8: k19, m1, k1, m1, k10, m1, k1, m1, k19. 54 sts □ Row 10: k19, m1, k1, m1, k14, m1, k1, m1, k19. 58 sts □ Row 12: k19, m1, k1, m1, k18, m1, k1, m1, k19. 62 sts □ Row 14: k19. m1. k1. m1. k22, m1, k1, m1, k19. 66 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work 13 rows in st st

Shape shoulders

□ Row 1 (RS): (k8, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k8) three times. 60 sts \square Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 5: (k7, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k7) three times. 54 sts □ Row 6 and all foll even-numbered rows: p to end \Box Row 7: (k6, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k6) three times. 48 sts \Box Row 9: (k5, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k5) three times. 42 sts \Box Row 11: (k4, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k4) three times. 36 sts Row 13: (k3, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k3) three times. 30 sts Row 15: (k2, k2tog) three times, k6, (k2tog, k2) three times. 24 sts Row 16: p to end

Stuffing TOYS

For best results, tease out your stuffing beforehand as this will prevent any lumps and bumps. You'll also need to strike the perfect balance between over and under stuffing your project so don't be afraid to start again if your toy doesn't sit right. Finally, make use of a smaller needle to help you reach awkward areas like the ends of the wings.

Increase for Head

Row 1 (RS): k1, m1, k to last st, m1. k1. 26 sts Row 2: p to end \Box Row 3: (k3, kfb) three times, k2, (kfb, k3) three times. 32 sts Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 7: (k4, kfb) three times, k2, (kfb, k4) three times. 38 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 11: (k5, kfb) three times, k2, (kfb, k5) three times. 44 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 15: (k6, kfb) three times, k2, (kfb, k6) three times. 50 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work five rows in st st \Box Row 21: (k6, k2tog) three times, k2, (k6, k2tog) three times. 44 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 25: (k5, k2tog) three times, k2, (k5, k2tog) three times. 38 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 29: (k4, k2tog) three times, k2, (k4, k2tog) three times. 32 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st \Box Row 33: (k3, k2tog) three times, k2, (k3, k2tog) three times. 26 sts Row 34: p to end \Box Row 35: (k2, k2tog) three times, k2, (k2tog, k2) three times. 20 sts Row 36: p to end \Box Row 37: (k1, k2tog) three times, k2, (k2tog, k1) three times. 14 sts Row 38: p to end Row 39: k1, skpo, k to last three sts, k2tog, k1. 12 sts □ Rep Rows 38-39 three times more. Six sts \square Beg with a p row, work five rows in st st □ Cast off

WING (make two) Using 3.25mm needles and yarn B, cast on nine sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 4 (RS): (k1, kfb) four times, k1. 13 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 8: k1, kfb, k3, kfb, k1, kfb, k3, kfb, k1. 17 sts Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 12: k1, kfb, k5, kfb, k1, kfb, k5, kfb, k1. 21 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 16: k1, kfb, k7, kfb, k1, kfb, k7, kfb, k1. 25 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 20: k1, kfb, k9, kfb, k1, kfb, k9, kfb, k1. 29 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 24: k1, skpo, k9, skpo, k1, k2tog, k9, k2tog, k1. 25 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 28: k1, skpo, k7, skpo, k1, k2tog, k7, k2tog, k1. 21 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 32: k1, skpo, k5, skpo, k1, k2tog, k5, k2tog, k1. 17 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st □ Row 36: k1, skpo, k3, skpo, k1, k2tog, k3, k2tog, k1. 13 sts Row 40: p to end □ Cast off

FOOT (make two) Using 3.25mm needles and yarn D, cast on eight sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 4: k4, m1, k4. Nine sts □ Row 5 and all foll odd-numbered rows: p to end □ Row 6: (k3, m1) twice, k3. 11 sts □ Row 8: k3, m1, k5, m1, k3. 13 sts □ Row 10: k3, m1, k7, m1, k3. 15 sts \Box Beg with a p row, work seven rows in st st □ Row 18: k3, skpo, k5, k2tog, k3.13 sts □ Row 19 and all foll odd-numbered rows: p to end □ Row 20: k3, skpo, k3, k2tog, k3. 11 sts □ Row 22: k3, skpo, k1, k2tog, k3. Nine sts □ Row 24: k3, skpo, k4. Eight sts \Box Beg with a p row, work three

rows in st st □ Cast off

BEAK

Using 3.25mm needles and yarn D, cast on three sts Row 1: p to end Row 2 (RS): (kfb) to end. Six sts Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 6: (kfb) to end. 12 sts Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Row 10: (k1, kfb) to end. 18 sts Beg with a p row, work three rows in st st Cast off

SCARF

Using 3.25mm needles and yarn C, cast on 135 sts Rows 1-2: k to end Cut yarn Rep Rows 1-2 six times more working the foll two-row colour sequence: yarn D, yarn E, yarn F, yarn G, yarn H, yarn C Cast off

TO MAKE UP

On Body and Head piece, stitch Back seam, including base, leaving a small gap halfway up Body. If using safety eyes, place these now. Place a small plastic disc in base, if using, then stuff. Stitch gap closed. Stitch cast-on edge of Back around base, following line of plastic disc and making sure Back seam will be covered. Wrap Back piece around Body and Head. Pin small cast-off edge of Cowl to centre of face, then pin and stitch long edges in place. Fold each Wing in half lengthways, with RS together and stitch seam, leaving a small gap for turning. Turn, stuff lightly, and stitch gap closed. Stitch cast-off edge of each Wing to Shoulders on either side. For Feet, fold each one in half with RS together, lining up cast-on and cast-off edges. Turn RS out, stuff lightly and stitch in place at base of Body. Seam Beak leaving top open, stuff lightly, close with seam underneath, then sew to face below tip of Cowl. If using, sew on bead eyes either side of Beak, pulling thread to create eye socket. Do not weave in ends of Scarf; instead, knot them to make a fringe, adding extra lengths with a Lark's Head knot where needed LK
