

INSPIRING YOUR CREATIVITY

CROCHETED BUNTING



This bunting uses double knit (DK) yarn. The pattern creates a line of holes on the top edge using a treble stitch, to enable a ribbon tape to be threaded through. The remainder of the flag is done in double crochet.

Materials:

100g double knit in red/white/blue & 3.5 or 4mm hook.

Finished size:

Each pennant measures approximately 18cm wide (7") and 18cm long (7").

Abbreviations:

ch: chain

dc: double crochet

tr: treble

sk: skip one stitch

Pattern using Double Knit (DK) yarn:

Using a 3.5mm or 4mm hook, Chain 2

Row 1: 2dc into 2nd ch from hook (2 stitches)

Row 2: 2dc into each stitch. Ch1, turn (4 stitches)

Row 3: dc across row. Ch1, turn (4)

Row 4: 2dc into 1st stitch, dc2, 2dc into last stitch. Ch1, turn (6)

Row 5: dc across row. Ch1, turn (6)

Row 6: 2dc into 1st stitch, dc4, 2dc into last stitch. Ch1, turn (8)

Row 5: dc across row. Ch1, turn (8)

Row 6: 2dc into 1st stitch, dc6, 2dc into last stitch. Ch1, turn (10)

Row 5: dc across row. Ch1, turn (10)

Row 6: 2dc into 1st stitch, dc6, 2dc into last stitch. Ch1, turn (12)

Row 5: dc across row. Ch1, turn (12)

Repeat the rows in this manner (2dc in first and last stitch on even rows, and one row of dc on the odd rows) until you have 28 stitches (or the flag is the required size, less 1cm). finish with a dc (odd) row and make 2 chains before turning.

To make the loops:

Next: tr into 1st stitch, ch1, skip stitch, tr, ch1, skip stitch. Repeat until end of row.

Next: dc in each stitch across row. Fasten off and weave/sew in ends.

Make as many pennants as you need using all three colours of yarn

Supplies are all available from Haberdasherdo on Southbourne Grove. There is also an outlet in the Fantastic Things Emporium in Saxon Square, Christchurch.

DK yarn from £2.45 per 100g ball and will make loads of pennants!

KNITTED BUNTING

This bunting uses double knit (DK) yarn. The pattern creates a line of holes on the top edge, to enable a ribbon tape to be threaded through. Using garter stitch means the edges don't curl and it looks just as good from both sides!

Materials:

100g double knit in red/white/blue & 4mm needles

Finished size:

Each pennant measures approximately 15cm wide (6") and 18cm long (7").

Abbreviations:

yo (yarn over) – put the yarn at the front of the work before you knit the next stitch (this creates a hole and an extra stitch)

k2tog (knit 2 together) - knit the next 2 stitches together as if one stitch (decreases by 1 stitch) skpo: slip one, knit one, pass the slipped stitch over psso: Pass slip stitch over

Pattern using Double Knit (DK) yarn:

Using 4mm needles cast on 38 stitches

Row 1: Knit Row 2: Knit

Row 3: K1, *(K2tog, yo, K1) repeat from * to last stitch, K1

Row 4: Knit Row 5: Knit

Row 6: K1, skpo, knit to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1 (36 sts)

Row 7: Knit

Repeat rows 4 to 7 until 4sts remain Next Row: K1, slip1, K2tog, psso (2 sts)

Next Row: K2tog

Cut yarn and secure stitch. Sew in the ends. Make as many pennants as you need using all three colours of yarn

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
